

To All International Students (Japanese Language School Teachers),

Hello! This is the Admission Office of Osaka Health and Welfare Technical College.

In order to provide easily understandable information about Osaka Health and Welfare Technical College's tuition fees, financial support, admission requirements, and entrance exams for international students, we have compiled this information in various languages from different countries. (Please note that there may be some variations in expression, but we hope for your understanding in this regard.)

In the first year, tuition fees vary depending on the program. It typically includes textbook costs, uniform (white coat and shoes) expenses, training attire, alumni association fees, alumni reunion fees, health management fees, etc., amounting to approximately 200,000 yen to 250,000 yen.

From the second year onwards, the costs decrease to around 100,000 yen to 150,000 yen, covering expenses such as textbook fees, alumni association fees, and health management fees.

Important:

Textbook fees and certification examination fees will be settled at the end of each academic year and refunded at the end of your graduation year.

Payment of tuition fees can also be arranged in installments. Please inquire for more details.

Financial Support:

Financial Assistance for Certified Care Workers: This program provides interest-free loans to individuals pursuing a certified care worker qualification (applicable to Osaka and Hyogo Prefectures). After graduating from our college and working for five consecutive years in care or counseling support roles within Osaka Prefecture, the loan will be exempted. You can receive a maximum of 1.2 million yen over two years.

Note: A guarantor residing in Japan is required for application after enrollment.

Facility Scholarship Program: Upon graduation, if you work in a designated welfare facility for a specified period, the scholarship amount received during your studies will be fully exempted from repayment. The scholarship amount varies (80,000 to 100,000 yen), depending on the facility.

Note: Negotiations with welfare facilities are necessary.

Recruitment Guidelines for the 2024 Academic Year – Study Aptitude AO Entrance

Examination for International Students

(Notice)

Eligible Programs:

- Care Welfare Program (2-year daytime program) *For information on other programs, please contact the Admission Office.*

Eligibility Criteria: You may apply only if you meet all of the following conditions:

1. Have obtained or are expected to obtain a Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N3 level or higher. In the case of expected qualification, you are required to achieve at least N2 (N3) equivalent proficiency by the time of enrollment.
2. Have completed 12 years of education equivalent to Japanese high school graduation.
3. Have attended our college's Open Campus (Information Session) at least once and have a clear understanding of our educational offerings.

Examination Schedule: The examination dates will be adjusted as needed based on the situation.

Application Period: Applications must be received by 5:00 PM two days before each examination date.

Please submit the following documents:

Required Documents for Application (6 items):

- Application for Admission
- Examination Ticket and Examination Registration Form
- Study Aptitude AO Entrance Examination Entry Sheet
- Graduation Certificate from a Japanese high school or an educational institution equivalent to a Japanese university or junior college
- Expected Graduation Certificate and Transcript from a Japanese language school
- Certificate of Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) pass

Examination Fee: 20,000 yen

Examination Contents (Subjects): Document screening, essay writing, pre-lesson, individual interview (approximately 15 minutes)

Examination Venue: Osaka Health and Welfare College *Note: In principle, examinations cannot be taken outside Japan.*

Announcement of Results: The results will be sent by mail to the address provided on the application within one week after the examination. Please note that we are unable to respond to inquiries by phone or email.
